Search Committee Report

Report on Town Hall Meetings

The search committee is in the process of looking at the data and comments collected at the Town Hall meetings in order to complete our parish profile. We were very successful in the number of responses with about 60% of our active congregants attending a meeting or submitting the questionnaire online. Here are some highlights from the questionnaire:

- 70% think our congregation is somewhat healthy, with another 15% feeling our congregation is very healthy. There were some responses that were neutral and only 3 that felt we were somewhat unhealthy.
- 55% think the conflicts of the past are somewhat resolved with another 15% feeling they have been very resolved. 10% still feel that issues are somewhat unresolved and a few with no opinion (weren't here, etc.). 2 people felt that conflicts are still very unresolved.
- We are very happy to report that 90% of respondents are feeling wellinformed!

In answer to the question, "What one thing brought you here?" most had to do with spiritual needs, community of St. James, brought as a child (cradle Episcopalian), wanted to worship where all are accepted, didn't want Mormon influence to pull children away and St. James was close in proximity.

In answer to the question, "What main thing keeps you here?" The themes of friends, family, spirituality, community, ministry, our service to others were prevalent.

We invite all former Senior and Junior Wardens to meet with us after church on Sunday, December 3rd at 11:30 - grab a coffee and meet us in the Common Room. 

Jordan Valley students have severe multiple disabilities including autism, cerebral palsy, traumatic brain injury, seizure disorders, communication impairments, genetic disorders and syndromes, deaf-blindness, and students who are extremely medically fragile.

Caring for these kids is very difficult and is made more difficult if the family is having financial troubles. Each year, some of the families turn to St. James for help with Thanksgiving meals and for decades you have responded generously. Now through November 20th, we will be collecting Thanksgiving "fixins". Please donate instant potatoes, gravy, sweet potatoes/yams, canned vegetables and fruit, stuffing, and desserts.
